The workshop focuses on the possibilities and variables of selection -- what to choose as a focal point, where to locate it within the frame for maximum effect. Participants will be encouraged to work on a number of pieces during the workshop. Although instruction will be given in watercolor and gouache, participants are welcome to work in other media.

The workshop will take place at historic Millbrook Village, which offers a variety of architectural and earth-bound subjects with an afternoon break for lunch. The suggested dress and provisions for a day in the country should include boots or closed shoes with treads, light and loose fitting long sleeves and pants, a hat, insect repellent and sunscreen. Bring a picnic style lunch and supplies for painting in watercolors outdoors. A list of recommended supplies is available upon request. Meet at the Millbrook Village picnic tables.
