Second PAHA "Paint Out"

The second annual PAHA "Paint Out", an outdoor event for 'en plein air' painters, is set for Saturday, November 1, starting at 10 a.m., at Millbrook Village.

The paint out takes place in the Pahaquarry region of Hardwick Township. Pahaquarry, a former township, which Hardwick annexed in 1997, abounds with rural beauty and scenic trails offering landscape painters a variety of fabulous backdrops. Photographers are welcomed to participate in this yearly event.

The day begins with the artists meeting for a breakfast reception and registration in the picnic area of Millbrook Village. The artists will then disperse to any public location within the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area (DWGNRA) to paint or photograph. PAHA will supply maps and information to help orient the participants to the area.

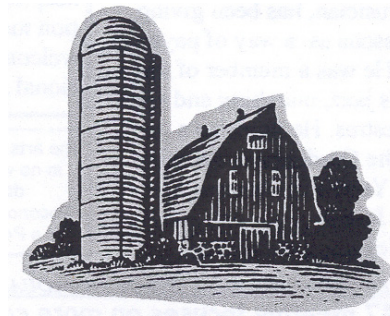
A buffet lunch, provided by PAHA, will await the painters and photographers, between 12:30 to 2:00 p.m., when the artists return from their morning activities. After lunch, the artists will set out again to paint or photograph the varied woodland landscape and old-style farmsteads. The "Paint Out" ends at 5:00 p.m.

PAHA offers local venues to the participating artists for their work produced during programs like the "Paint Out". The rain date for the paint out is Sunday, November 2.



Trenton Recognizes PAHA

The State of New Jersey officially recognized the Pahaquarry Association for History and the Arts, Inc., (PAHA), as a nonprofit organization on June 27, 2008. "It's the first of many steps for our new organization", said Brian Daum, PAHA president and co-founder. "Our group evolved from another nonprofit organization, The Pahaquarry Foundation, which the late Jean Zipser founded in 1997".



PAHA hopes to establish a permanent home inside the DWGNRA and collaborate with similar organizations and the National Park Service (NPS) in preserving and maintaining the historic integrity and cultural resources inside the park.

"Our biggest task ahead of us, in order to achieve an NPS endorsement and to accomplish our goals, is raising funds," said Daum. "Without sufficient funds, PAHA is just another well-meaning group with an ambitious dream."
