PAHA's Annual Spring Event

PAHA's annual spring "Shoot Out /Paint Out", an outdoor event for photographers and artists, is set for Saturday, May 30, starting at 10 a.m., at the B.B. Van Campen/Julia Orthwine House.

The program takes place in the Pahaquarry region of Hardwick Township. Pahaquarry, a former township which Hardwick annexed in 1997, abounds with rural beauty and scenic trails and offers landscape painters and photographers a variety of fabulous backdrops.

The day begins with the artists meeting for a breakfast reception and registration at the B.B. Van Campen/Julia Orthwine House. The fee for the day is \$20. The photographers and artists will then disperse to any public location within the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area (DWGNRA) to photograph or paint. PAHA will supply maps and information to help orient the participants to the area.

A buffet lunch, provided by PAHA, will await the painters and photographers, between 12:30 to 2:00 p.m., when the artists return from their morning activities. After lunch, the artists will set out again to paint or photograph the varied woodland landscape and old-style farmsteads. The "Shoot Out/Paint Out" ends at 5:00 p.m.

PAHA offers participating artists local venues to exhibit work produced during PAHA sponsored programs such as the "Paint Out". The rain date for the paint out is Sunday, June 1.

PAHA to Exhibit Artwork in Oxford

The Pahaquarry Association for History and the Arts, Inc. will present its second annual "Paint Out/ Shoot Out" art exhibition at the Oxford Municipal Art Gallery from June 6 to August 1. Artists and photographers who participated in past PAHA or Pahaquarry Foundation, Inc. programs, such as en plein air workshops, paint outs or shoot outs,



are welcome to submit their work for this exhibit. New artists are welcomed. Interested artists should deliver their work to the gallery on Saturday, June 6, from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. For more information, call 908-387-0904.

PAHA will host an artists' reception, with an encore presentation of the "Ghost Waters" documentary on Sunday, June 21, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. The documentary revisits the effects of the Tocks Island Dam Project, which permanently displaced entire communities and heralded the formation of the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area.

ENCORE PRESENTATION OF GHOST WATERS FILM

The Pahaquarry Association for History and the Arts, Inc. (PAHA) and Warren County ARTS, Inc., have scheduled an encore presentation of the "Ghost Waters" documentary during PAHA's art exhibit and artists' reception at the Oxford Municipal Art Gallery on Sunday, June 21. The reception runs from 2 P.M. to 5 P.M.

The Ghost Waters documentary focuses upon the Tocks Island Dam project, initiated in the mid-1960's by the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers, and its impact on the communities within the Pahaquarry and Walpack regions along the upper Delaware valley in northwestern New Jersey.

Filmmaker, Nick Patrick will introduce the documentary and answer questions from the audience. Patrick has and continues to screen this short version of his documentary to bring awareness to the Ghost Waters project and to raise funds to help complete the full feature version of this film. The short version runs approximately forty minutes. The screening is free to the public. PAHA will offer refreshments during the reception.
